One of the greatest encouragements to me as your pastor is when people brag on <u>you</u>! That has happened twice recently from people who have attended our church on a regular basis.

I will always remember the first time I met Leon Hyatt and his lovely bride. Wow! What an impression they made on me. At 53 years old, I remember thinking I would like to experience just a tiny smoldering, ember of the Holy Spirit's fire that burst forth from this sweet godly couple who were 40 or more years older than I was.

From what I experienced during my short time in CENLA, that powerful fire of God was burning brightly in many hearts assembled at First Baptist Pineville. I experienced God's presence powerfully among your people in a relatively short time especially in some of the men who ministered to me personally (they know who they are).

What moved my heart most profoundly were the tears I could not help notice running down the faces of people who found themselves in the presence of the Living God as we worshipped on Sunday mornings; one week the face of an elderly woman or man; the next week the face of a college or high school student. As I have worshipped with God's people around the globe over the past 35 years I have noticed that such tenderness of heart can be rare although it is more readily observed in settings such as a military chapel tent in Afghanistan.

Thank you for blessing me and ministering to me during my time in CENLA. If I get back to Louisiana in the future, I will make every effort to say hello. If not, I look forward to seeing you in glory and having your precious son Evan lead us as we worship Jesus and dance on the streets of gold.

What encouraging words! Thank you, Church, for touching lives as we do life together. All of this is why it's a great time to Be F.I.R.S.T.!



### "Historical" Windfall Received - No April Fools!

On April 1, a deposit of \$647,154 was made to our church bank account. No, it wasn't an April Fool's joke! It was a payment from CLECO for our historical tax credits.

Since 2002, the Louisiana Office of Cultural Development, Division of Historical Preservation Tax Incentives, has offered a state commercial tax credit. The credit is available to historic properties in certified Downtown Development Districts who undergo substantial rehabilitation. Nonprofit entities may receive these tax credits and then sell them to a for profit business. The deal is a win/ win because the nonprofit gets money they wouldn't normally get, and the business saves on their taxes. Further, historical buildings are saved and downtown districts are restored.

Beginning in May of 2017, we began the long process of working on our application for historic tax credits on our sanctuary renovation project. In December of 2018, the state approved all parts of our application. In January, we began working with CLECO to purchase our tax credits. We finalized that deal on March 11. After one final act by the state, transferring our credits to CLECO, we received payment on April 1. We are grateful for our friends at CLECO who purchased our credits at a generous rate.

While this is "free" money, it took a lot of work from a number of people. First, we are grateful for Paul Smith Historical Preservation Consulting who helped us get our applications made to the state. Second, Doug Ashe and Amy Wallace with Ashe Broussard Weinzettle Architects did an enormous amount of work backtracking through the project to get plans together, before and after pictures, invoices, and more for our application. Third, at one point, we ran into a snag and Mike Johnson made a phone call to the Lt. Governor to help us out. He did. Finally, Jimmy Holsomback first mentioned the possibility of applying for tax credits several years ago. Had he not mentioned the possibility (and checked back a year or so later), we probably would not have ever known about this!

In coming days, our Finance Committee will recommend a plan for how best to use this money to pay down debt, shore up our contingency funds, and invest in future ministry. In the meantime, the money is in an interest earning account. We are grateful for God's provision. Where He guides, He provides.




### Guest Speaker, Dr. Chuck Kelley, Jr. Sunday, April 28

Dr. Kelley is the eighth president of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. A professor of evangelism at New Orleans Seminary since August 1983, Dr. Kelley assumed the office of president March 1, 1996. A much-requested public speaker

throughout the SBC, Dr. Kelley is recognized widely both for his evangelistic preaching and for his research on the area of church growth. He is the author of numerous denominational articles, training materials and books, including How Did They Do It? The Story of Southern Baptist Evangelism; and "The Roman Road" tract, teacher's guide, learner's guide and training video.

Dr. Kelley will be retiring from NOBTS this summer. We are grateful that he accepted our invitation to share with us during his final months.
